DELHI – RAJASTHAN – AGARA DETAILED PROGRAMM

Day 1: Delhi,

Upon your arrival at Delhi airport, welcome and transfer to the hotel, driver available to freshen up and rest: the visit of the city begins immediately. The classical monuments to visit are divided into the old part, called Old Delhi, and the new one, New Delhi. Today we will explore the old city, called Old Delhi. The Chandni Chowk market, chaotic, noisy, but unmissable, the Red Fort, a red sandstone fort surrounded by green areas and flowering gardens, the Jama Masjid, one of the largest Muslim mosques in the world. Not far away, there is the Gurudwara Bhangla Sahib, one of my favorite places in Delhi, a Sikh temple known for feeding tens of thousands of pilgrims of all religions who go there daily, a magical atmosphere reigns there that will leave you with a mark in the heart.

Day 2: Delhi - Mandawa

After breakfast departure for Mandawa. Along the way stop for lunch and visit the Piramal Haveli, a traditional house painted with angels and deities driving chariots on the walls. Arrival in Mandawa in the afternoon, check in at the hotel (). In the evening visit the traditional houses of the city. These houses, once the residences of wealthy merchants, still retain precious frescoes on the facades. You will also be able to admire the lifestyle of the inhabitants of this small town. A very cute little town, all the old houses haveli of pinto it looks like an open art gallery town, after visit return to the hotel

Day 3: Mandawa - Bikaner

After breakfast departure for Bikaner. Arrive in Bikaner and check in at the hotel. Start of the tour of the city, also known as the camel city. You will be able to see carts pulled by camels, women in traditional clothing and men with the typical turban crossing the streets of the city. In the afternoon visit Junagarh Fort, a large complex with bastions built in the 16th century. You will also see the Jain temples of Bandeshwar and the Deshnoke temple, where mice are venerated and considered sacred. In the evening, an hour and a half before sunset, an excellent tour of the ancient city (Silk Road, even past Marco to the historic centre) where you can see beautiful havelis, the spice market where Christmas was held in India 🖨 then the Jain temples which are the oldest in the city, this super authentic ride.

Day 4: Bikaner – Jaisalmer

After breakfast departure for Jaisalmer. Along the way, stop at the Kheechan nature oasis, a place where thousands of migratory birds stop in winter. The locals feed the birds that come to rest in the oasis, confident that they will return every year. You can see these migratory birds in winter on the tour. Arrival in Jaisalmer, registration and break. Visit the sand dunes near the city to see the sunset in the desert. I return and, better to sleep in the desert, something wonderful I get without Tourist, sleeping on the dunes under the stars, waiters make food in front of you then gaze at the beautiful stars in the evening, early morning in the sunset, **ACTUALLY IT DEPENDS ON THE PEOPLE WHETHER YOU JUST TAKE A CAMEL RIDE WITH TRA MONTO OR SLEEP IN THE DESERT.**

Day 5: Jaisalmer

After breakfast, visit the city and the "Sonar fort", with its "golden" walls that seem to blossom from the desert dunes. In the fort you will see beautiful houses or "havelis" with intricately decorated balconies and terraces. There are many havelis throughout the city which create a medieval ambience. You will also visit the nearby Gadisar Lake and the museum. After visiting the city, departure for the sand dunes of Sam, 50 km from Jaisalmer to admire the beauty of the Rajasthan desert. Day 6 : Jaisalmer - Jodhpur 5 hours

After breakfast departure for Jodhpur. Along the way stop at the Osiyan desert oases with beautiful Hindu and Jain temples. Arrival in Jodhpur, registration and break at the chosen hotel. Start of the visit to the city. V After breakfast, departure for a visit to Mehrangarh Fort, one of the largest forts in India where you will find beautiful palaces and an exhibition of royal armaments. Then visit the historic center on foot in the area where there are the blue houses. Return to the hotel to rest or go shopping in the city market. Return and overnight stay at the hotel (WRITE HOTEL NAME)

Day 7: Jodhpur - Udaipur

By car after breakfast departure for Udaipur. Along the way stop at Ranakpur temple, one of the largest Jain temple complexes in India. The most famous temples of the complex are the Chaumukha, the Neminath and the Parashnath Temple., The stop in Rankpur, Rankpur a city where there is one of the most beautiful Jain temples in India where there

is a temple that has a 1444 sculpted marble column, a temple where you can see the art of hand, a stupendous work.

Day 8: Udaipur

After breakfast, visit the city of Udaipur: the City Palace, a large palace with beautiful architecture; the Jagdish Temple, dedicated to Lord Vishnu; the museum of arts and folklore with colorful dolls, musical instruments and paintings. In the afternoon you can visit the city center or take a boat on Lake Pichola and see the fabulous water palaces of Udaipur, the Jag Mandir and the Jag Niwas now known as the Taj Lake Palace, where you will dine in a regal environment. Day 9: Departure from Udaipur for Pushkar 6 hours

After breakfast depart for the pilgrimage town of Pushkar. Arrival in Pushkar in the afternoon and check-in at the chosen hotel. In the evening visit the city with its splendid lake and its temples, in particular the Brahma temple, the only Brahma temple in India. Pushkar Lake is considered a sacred place by Hindus who flock there during religious holidays. Even the hippie city, many Europians live in the beautiful, small city, very famous.

Day 10. Udaipur_ Jaipur

After breakfast, city tour of Jaipur. In the beautiful pink city built by Maharaja Sawai Singh chief place of RAJAsthan Even famous is said there Jewelry city famous for stones @ carpets(shopping) jaipur we have two night visit next Day you want you can go for massage or rest even more go with driver to monkey temple my favorite place.

Day 11 visit to Jaipur

Breakfast at hotel. Departure for Jaipur Jaipur - Day In the morning visit the Amber Fort, which dates back to the 16th century, preserves numerous finely inlaid rooms inside and is located on the top of a hill about ten kilometers from the city. Afternoon dedicated to visiting the city and its surroundings: the City Palace, with interesting artistic collections from the Mughal era, and the astronomical observatory, built in the 18th century, the facade of the so-called "Palace of the Winds". The lively capital of Rajasthan is commonly called the "pink city" due to the color of the buildings that characterize the old part. The ancient fortified city occupies the area north-east of Jaipur, while the new part extends in the south-west direction. Jaipur owes its foundation, its planning and its name to the great

maharaja warrior and astronomer Jai Singh Secondo who stood out on a political level for having been able to maintain good relations with the Mughals according to a tradition already inaugurated by his predecessors.

Day 12 departure for Agra with stop in Fatehpur Sikri

The UNESCO heritage city, Breakfast at the hotel. Departure for Agra. Before arrival, stop in Abhaneri with a visit to the ruins of an ancient Hindu temple/stepwell. Abhaneri small but charming village in eastern Rajasthan, famous for its medieval monuments, 35km from Agra, Fatehpur Sikri is the red sandstone city built in the 16th century. by the Mughal Emperor Akbar and subsequently abandoned due to lack of water. The emperor, broadminded for the time, of Muslim religion, married a Rajput princess, of Hindu religion, so as to be able to unite the two cultures. Fatehpur Sikri is an example of combining Hindu and Muslim architecture and exemplifies Akbar's idea of synthesizing the two cultures. Here is an important proposal if you want to go to Varanasi by night train from Agra, visit Taj Mahal all afternoon then leave for Varanasi by train at night, it takes 12 hours, on the return from Varanasi internal flight, if you don't want to go by train sleep in Agra visit Taj Mahal in the dawn then departure for Delhi to take domestic flight

Day 13: Agra - - Delhi

Wake up at dawn and visit the Taj Mahal at 6 in the morning. Breathtaking view of the Taj Mahal at sunrise. This time of day is perfect for taking stunning photos of this beautiful white marble monument. The Taj Mahal, the finest example of Islamic architecture in India, was built by Emperor Shah Jahan for his queen Mumtaz Mahal and has become the symbol of eternal love. Return to the hotel for breakfast.
